
"LAURA"

Indigenous Pima Elder who guides Christi's search for Laura by telling her the story of "The Seer Who Would Not See."





CORONADO

Age: 30-32

OPPENHEIMER

Age: 36-40

Oppenheimer was the wartime head of the Los Alamos Laboratory and is often credited as the "father of the atomic bomb" for his role in the Manhattan Project during World War II.



GEORGE SAXON

Age: 18-86
